2018 (Sunset to Sunset)

- Sept. 9th – 10th: Rosh Hashanah (Yom Teruah/ Feast of Trumpets) Sabbath/No work day
- Sept. 11th – 12th: Fast of Gedaliah (mentioned in Zech. 8:19)
- Sept. 18th – 19th: Yom Kippur (Day of Atonement) Sabbath/No Work day; Fast day
- Sept. 23rd – Oct. 1st: Sukkot (Feast of Tabernacles)
 - 23rd – 24th: Sabbath/No work day
 - 30th – 1st: Sabbath/No work day
- Oct. 1st – 2nd: Simchat Torah (Rejoicing in the Torah)
- Dec. 2nd – 10th: Chanukah
- Dec. 17th – 18th: Fast of the 10th of Tevet (mentioned in Zech. 8:19)

2019 (Sunset to Sunset)

- Jan. 20th – 21st: Tu B'Shevat (New Year for the Trees)
- March 19th – 20th: Fast of Esther
- March 20th – 21st: Purim
- March 21st – 22nd: Shushan Purim
- April 18th – 19th: Pesach (Passover)
- April 19th – 26th: Feast of Unleavened Bread (No leaven for 7 days.)
 - 19th – 20th: Sabbath/No work day
 - 25th – 26th: Sabbath/No work day
- April 20th – 21st: Feast of First Fruits
- April 21st – June 9th: Omer (Count for 50 days)
- May 1st – 2nd: Yom Hashoah (Holocaust Remembrance Day)
- May 7th – 8th: Yom HaZikaron (Israel's Memorial Day)
- May 8th – 9th: Yom Ha'atzmaut (Israel's Independence Day)
- May 18th – 19th: Pesach Sheni (Biblically allotted day to "make-up" Passover if you missed it in April.)
- June 1st – 2nd: Yom Yerushalayim (Jerusalem Day)
- June 8th – 9th: Shavuot (Pentecost) Shabbat/No work day
- July 20th – 21st: Fast for the 17th of Tammuz observed (mentioned in Zech. 8:19)
- Aug. 10th – 11th: Fast for the 9th of Av observed (mentioned in Zech. 8:19)
- Aug. 15th – 16th: Tu B'Av (Like Israel's valentine's day)
- Sept. 29th – 30th: Rosh Hashanah (Yom Teruah/Feast of Trumpets) Sabbath/No work day
- Oct. 1st – 2nd: Fast of Gedaliah (mentioned in Zech. 8:19)
- Oct. 8th – 9th: Yom Kippur (Day of Atonement) Sabbath/No work day; Fast day

- Oct. 13th – 21st: Sukkot (Feast of Tabernacles)
 - 13th – 14th: Sabbath/No work day
 - 20th – 21st: Sabbath/No work day
