




This month we have a few events:



Recipes

Garlic Chicken

Serves 4-5 Prep Time: 15 Minutes Cook Time: 1 Hour

Ingredients:

6 Chicken Breasts

1 Stick Margarine (room temp)

3-4 Cloves of Garlic, peeled and minced

Salt and Pepper to taste

Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.

2. Beat the margarine and mix with garlic; add 1/8 tsp salt

3. Rub the garlic butter on the chicken breast and sprinkle with salt and pepper

4. Bake for 60 minutes or until golden brown, basting often

Stuffed Tomatoes

Serves 6 Prep Time: 20 Minutes Cook Time: 20-25 Minutes

Ingredients:

6 Medium Tomatoes

2 Tablespoons Olive Oil

3 Tablespoons chopped onion

1-2 Cloves Garlic, Minced

1-4 Cup Bread Crumbs

¾ Cup Shredded Mozzarella Cheese

¼ Teaspoon Salt

1/8 Teaspoon Pepper

Directions:

1. Cut the top quarter off the tomatoes, then cut a very thin sliver off the bottoms so they will sit upright. Using your knife, clean out the insides of the tomatoes as best you can without tearing the outer skin. Discard the seeds but keep and coarsely chop the tomato flesh.

2. In a saucepan, heat the olive oil and sauté the onions and garlic.

3. Add the reserved chopped tomato and sauté for 5-6 minutes or until soft.

4. Remove from heat and add bread crumbs, ½ cup of the mozzarella cheese, and salt and pepper.

5. Preheat the oven 350 degrees F. Coat a shallow baking dish with cooking spray.

6. Spoon the sauté mixture into the hollowed tomatoes and place them in the baking dish.

7. Sprinkle the tops with the remaining mozzarella cheese.

8. Bake for 20-25 minutes or until cheese is melted.

Dairy Free Blueberry Chia Seed Pudding

serves 2

Ingredients:

1 cup So Delicious unsweetened coconut milk

1/4 cup fresh blueberries

2 tablespoon pure maple syrup

1/2 teaspoon pure vanilla extract

1/4 chia seeds

additional fresh blueberries, for garnish

Directions:

Add coconut milk, blueberries, maple syrup and vanilla to blender.

Blend on high to puree blueberries, about 1-2 minutes. Pour into mason jar or small bowl and mix in chia seeds. Cover and refrigerate for 3 hours or overnight. Serve with additional fresh blueberries.

This Month in History

-Kislev 28: Deganiya Alef, Israel's (then known as Palestine) first kibbutz was founded, 1909; Jews of Great Russia expelled by order of Empress Elizabeth, 1742; David Ben-Gurion died, 1973; Portuguese Jewish statesman Manuel Fernando de Villareal executed by the Inquisition, 1652.

-Kislev 29: Touro Synagogue of Newport, Rhode Island, oldest

existing shul in the U.S. dedicated 1763.

-Tevet 7: Three leaders of Babylonian Jewry were arrested by Persian officials, 468, sparking a wave of persecution of the Jews of Babylonia; Supposed liberties granted Russian Jews by the Czar in 1804, actually spelled economic ruin for much of the Jewish community; The Prussian government decreed that Jewish services must be conducted in strict adherence to Jewish Tradition, 1823. The decree was "solicited" by the Traditional Jewish community in order to fight against the new Reform movement. Ultimately, however, we suffer much more harm from governmental intervention than good.

-Tevet 8: First translation of the Torah into a foreign language (Greek). Considered a tragic event; ancient fast day; Eichmann sentenced to death, 1961.

-Tevet 9: Yahrzeit of Ezra Hasofer and Nechemia. Ancient fast day.

-Tevet 10: Asara B'Tevet, one of the four commemorative fasts mentioned by Zecharia HaNavi; Beginning of the siege around Jerusalem, 588 b.c.e.; Yirmiyahu bought a field and prophesied that we will once again buy homes and land in Eretz Yisrael, 587 b.c.e.; Yahrzeits of Zecharia and Malachi.; King Herod captured Jerusalem, 37 b.c.e.; 3,000 Jews killed in Bucharest riots, 1941.; Memorial day for the six million Jews killed by the Nazis.

-Tevet 11: 100,000 Jews of Sicily expelled, 1492.

-Tevet 12: Yechezkial prophesied the downfall of Egypt and the triumph of Bavel, 587 b.c.e.; A violent earthquake rocked Eretz Yisrael seriously damaging the walls of Jerusalem and Tower of David, 1033; Another Mordechai and Esther (of Medzibezh) saved the Jews from Chmielnicki's army, 1648.

-Tevet 13: Jews were excluded by the Nazis from all employment benefits, 1939; First shul built in Spain in 600 was dedicated, 1968; The Spanish government officially voided the order of expulsion of 1492; First issue of the Hebrew printing press of Amsterdam (the Siddur), 1627; Rumanian Jews were excluded from the medical profession, 1868.

-Tevet 14: General U. S. Grant ordered the expulsion of Jews from the Department of Tennessee, 1862; Jews of Tel Aviv were expelled by the Turks and sent to Egypt, 1914; Jews of Laibach, Austria expelled, 1515; Population of Israel reached three million, 1971.

-Tevet 15: Empress Maria Theresa decreed the expulsion of all Jews from Prague, Bohemia and Moravia, 1774.

-Tevet 16: First edition of the Sefer Mitzvot Gadol published, Soncino, Italy, 1488.

-Tevet 17: Canada recognized Israel, 1948; The organization of the Jewish community of Rome was approved by the pope, 1524; Frederick William of Brandenburg issued a decree safeguarding the privileges of the Jews of Berlin, 1676.

-Tevet 18: Austrian constitution abolished discrimination based on religious differences, 1867; Two ships with "illegal" immigrants were taken by the British to Cyprus, 1947; Two years later - to the day - the British announced their intention to release the Cyprus internees.

-Tevet 19: S.S. commander of Treblinka sentenced to life imprisonment, 1970; Vilna massacres end, 32,000 Jews killed, 1941; The Catholic Church in Recife, Brazil closed the two shuls then in existence there, 1638.

-Tevet 20: Emancipation of the Jews of Hungary, 1867; The Pope bans conversion of Jewish children without consent of their parents, 1420; the Jewish community of Ancona, Italy miraculously escaped unharmed from an earthquake, 1690. They declared a fast day in commemoration; The Nazis prohibited Jews from congregating in shuls and private homes for prayer, 1940. So too, did they forbid Jews from changing residences - this, a precursor of the ghettos.

-Tevet 21: KKK founded in Tennessee, 1865; The desecration of a new shul in Cologne, Germany sparked a wave of anti-Jewish

incidents throughout Western Europe, the Americas, Australia, and Africa, 1959; Purim Ancona, followed the fast day mentioned above, for the 20 Tevet.

-Tevet 22: Anti-Jewish riots in different parts of Austria, 1312; King of Sicily requires Jews to wear a special badge, 1369; Anti-Jewish riots broke out in Warsaw, 1881; Menachem Begin and Anwar Sadat met in Ismailia, Egypt, 1977; Anti-Jewish riots in Ancona, Italy, 1798 (day after the "local" Purim which had been celebrated since 1691); Roman mobs attempted to set fire to the ghetto and to sack it, 1798

-Tevet 23: Barcelona granted the right to exclude Jews for all time, 1424; Religious freedom granted to Jews (and Catholics) in Brazil, 1634; Israel Philharmonic Orchestra founded, 1936. First concert was under the direction of Arturo Toscanini.

-Tevet 24: Followers of Zecharia of Kiev were burned in Moscow, 1503, on charges of Judaizing; Rumanian Jews were excluded from the medical profession, 1868.

-Tevet 25: The organizational meeting of the National Council of Young Israel took place, 1912; Anti-Jewish riots in different parts of Austria, 1312.

-Tevet 26: New York City authorities warn Jews about incompetent and unscrupulous mohalim who were causing the deaths of many Jewish infants, 1870; The JNF was founded, 1901; The ship, "The 29th of November", with "illegal" Jewish immigrants, was driven off the coast by the British, 1947; Jews of Sicily required to wear a special badge, 1369.

-Tevet 27: 40 Jewish workers were killed by Arabs at the Haifa refineries, 1947.

-Tevet 28: 100,000 Jews of Sicily were expelled, 1492; Decree of Empress Catherine restricted the right of residence of Russian Jews, 1791; A Russo-U.S. trade treaty, originally ratified in 1832, was abrogated by President Taft in 1912, because of Russian discrimination against Jews (who were American citizens); Israel's first desalination plant opened, 1963, Eilat; Jews of Switzerland were granted civic equality, 1866, upon pressure exerted by the United States which had interceded on behalf of American Jewish citizens.

-Tevet 29: Violent earthquake shook Eretz Yisrael; over 2000 died in Tzfat, another 700 in T'veriya, 1837; Several restrictions on Jewish ownership of land went into effect in Russia, 1808; The Decree for the Elimination of Jews from German Economic Life took effect, 1939; First Jewish censor was appointed by the Russian government, 1798, to censor all Hebrew books printed in Russia or imported from other countries. [Yosef Mendelovitch tells that when he was being transferred from one Russian prison to another, he was in temporary possession of his Chumash that had been confiscated when he was first imprisoned. He would have to give it up again upon arrival at the new prison. Also in his possession was a collection of selected speeches by Breshnev translated into Yiddish. This book was officially passed by the censor. He separated content from covers in both books, which happened to be of the same size, got rid of the speeches, and pasted (with well-chewed bread) the Chumash into the censor-approved cover. His Chumash passed cursory inspection at his new prison and was his unfailing companion during his incarceration.]; Nazis prohibited Jews from gathering in shuls or private homes for prayer, 1940; Recife, Brazil conquered by Portugal, ending the legal existence of the prosperous Jewish community there, 1654.
